Traditions Around the World

ICELAND:

- Starting 13 days before Christmas the Jólaveinar or Yule Lads. They play tricks on Icelandic children.
- Children put a shoe in the window. If they have been good they receive a gift. If bad the child receives a potato.
- January 6 is a special celebration of the Twelfth Night. This is when the elves and Yule Lad trolls come out and celebrate with the Icelanders, dancing and singing

LIBERIA:

- Most homes have an oil palm for a Christmas tree which is decorated with bells.
- Dinner is eaten outdoors, sitting in a circle sharing rice, beef & biscuits.

RUSSIA:

- Christmas Eve is celebrated on January 6th with a 12 course meal in honor of the 12 apostles.
- Babushka brings presents to the children.

GERMANY:

- Xmas preparations begin on December 6th
- Children leave letters on the windowsills.
- Germans hang wreaths of Holly & 4 red candles. They light one candle each Sunday & the last one on Christmas Eve

VENEZUELA:

- On December 16th families bring out their pesebres, a special nativity scene.
- On the morning of January 6th children discover the straw beside their beds has been replaced with gifts.
- Children know that Magi have visited if they have a black smudge on their cheek. This means they have been kissed by Bathazar.
