

Revitalized Haultain Park aiming for summer 2009 opening



The Haultain School and Park Restoration Project is now in its final phase and is aiming for a summer 2009 completion of the revitalized Haultain Park. Through this final phase, the park will enjoy a mini soccer field, winding pathways, additional seating, upgraded landscaping, and a bigger and better handicapped-accessible playground designed for children 18 months to 12 years.

While Parks Foundation Calgary has raised more than \$1.1 million for Phase III of this restoration project, they are still in need of an additional \$380,000 before March 31, 2009.

In addition to providing a safe outdoor environment for those living and working in the Beltline, the revitalized Haultain Park will help enhance the quality of inner city living, as well as provide much needed green space among one of the highest population densities in Calgary.

January 9 - February 14: Robyn Moody's *Constellation* at Stride Gallery's Project Room



In Robyn Moody's *Constellation*, LED lights are positioned throughout the blackened gallery space. As these are the only points of light, the architecture of the space effectively disappears, giving the impression of looking deep into the cosmos.

The relative positions of the LED's correspond exactly to lights from existing computer and stereo terminals and workstations. These are our new constellations "The Sleeping Mac", "The Printer and Scanner", "The Modem", etc.

Moody takes a whimsical and multifaceted approach to artmaking, incorporating electronics, film, performance, installation, sculpture, or whatever a project requires.
